Ralph Brown, Chair, Stow, is the former Vice President of Engineering at Ingenix, a division of UnitedHealth Group and former Chief Technology Officer and Vice President for Product Development at Integrated Development Enterprise (IDe) in Concord, MA. Prior to IDE, he was Director of Software at Lotus Development in Cambridge, MA and held other senior development and management positions including Managing Director of Paxton Computers, Limited in the UK.

Jeffrey Fuhrer, Vice Chair, Boxborough, *Strategic Action Committee Chair, Finance and Investment Committees*, is Executive Vice President and Director of the Research department at the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston; he is currently an Associate Economist of the Federal Open Market Committee. His group is responsible for providing monetary policy advice to the President of the Reserve Bank, and for conducting basic research into the conduct of monetary policy and the structure of the macro-economy.
